Dev Setup

Install system dependencies:

- Node v14
- Yarn v1.22.5

Install project dependencies:

- `yarn`

Run the dev server:

- `yarn dev`

Finally, checkout the local site & GraphQL sandbox at:

- <http://localhost:8000/>
- http://localhost:8000/__graphql

Dev Notes

Crucial Commands

`yarn dev`

Run the project locally with live reload in development mode.

`yarn build`

Run a production build into `./public`. The result is ready to be put on any static hosting you prefer.

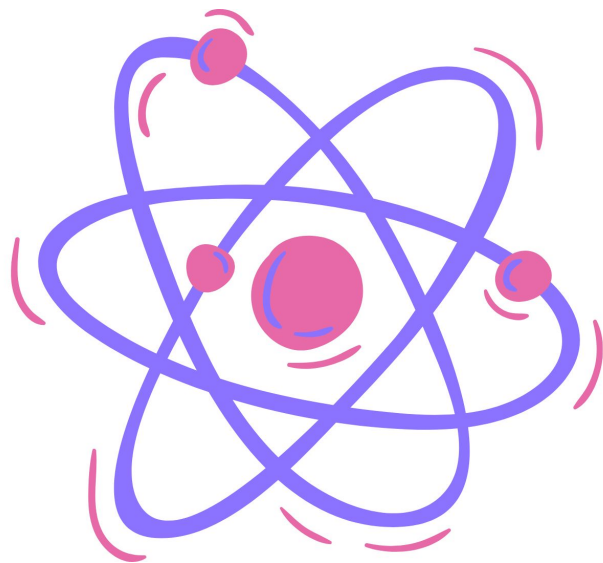

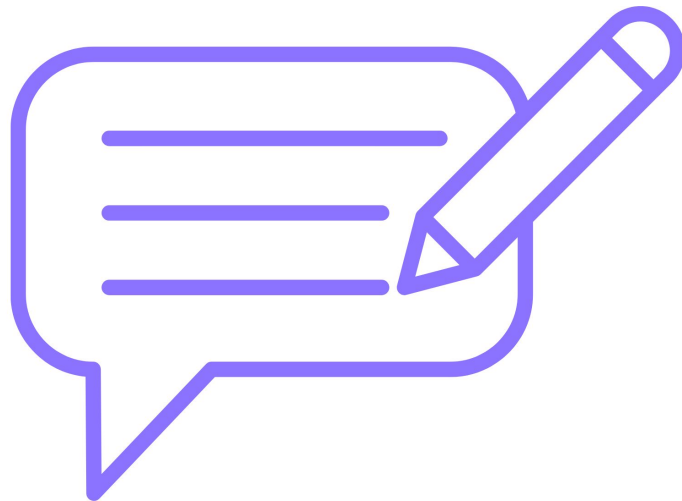

I faced this issue too, but with .net core 2.1. I'm not sure why it's working but, If this solution is available for you then try the following:

1



1. Restart Docker Desktop (This solution is offered in the output window)
2. Change the docker file.



I replaced this

Then debug started to work fine even after changing the docker file to start variant, including stops on breakpoints. And my configuration has one additional difference: I use Debug argument in the docker file and use Debug in Solution configuration

RUN dotnet build "DebugLinux.csproj" -c Debug -o /app/build
```

Do not provide or request help on projects that may break laws, breach terms of services, be considered malicious or inappropriate. The moderation team can take action against you without a reason or appeals.

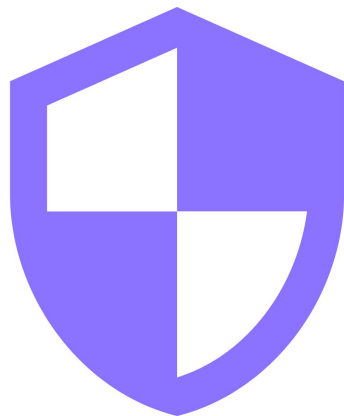
